Dear Friends,

What a joy it was to reunite at the Forum Auditorium for our 2022-2023 Season! We thrive on sharing live music with live audiences, and this past season of concerts reinforced the feeling of connection we experience together in our most special home of over ninety-two years.

This past season was certainly one to remember artistically, with unforgettable Masterworks Series soloists like Othalie Graham, Natasha Paremski, and HSO Concertmaster Peter Sirotin, plus performances of new works by Reena Esmail and Jennifer Higdon and HSO *first performances* of works by Leonard Bernstein, William Grant Still, and others.

Our Capital Blue Cross Pops Series, celebrating twenty-one years of partnership with Capital Blue, included the premiere of *Broadway's Bad Boys*, in addition to favorite sing-along tunes from the Jazz age, Motown, Paul Simon, and your favorite films, with some of today's most dynamic performers and our ever-versatile Harrisburg Symphony musicians.

The Harrisburg Symphony Youth Orchestras, who have grown in membership this season, performed three inspiring concerts at the Forum and Trinity Lutheran Church in Camp Hill. In May, they joined the HSO, three professional singers, the Sporting Hill Singers, and the Central Dauphin Ramband Drumline for an energetic side-by-side performance of Carnegie Hall's acclaimed *Link Up: The Orchestra Rocks!* for an audience of over 1,500 elementary school students.

But we at the HSO are more than just concerts at the Forum — we are people who love to connect with people around the community, in groups large or small, in classrooms or on stages, to share and celebrate the magic of music.

Outside the concert hall, our educational initiatives continue to build valuable relationships. Our Musician Residency Program, launched in 2021, takes HSO musicians to area high schools throughout the academic year to work together. And our two recent instrument drives collected twenty-five string, wind, and brass instruments which have been refurbished and donated to Foose Elementary. This project is supported by donors to the Let the Music Grow education fund.

Our friends at the Harrisburg Symphony Society, also growing in membership, hosted two friend-raisers this season and pulled out all the stops at April's *An Elegant Evening at the Capital Supper Club* gala at the Harrisburg Hilton, raising over \$97,000 in truly glamorous fashion. We are extremely grateful for their tireless support.



None of our 2022-2023 Season would have been possible without the participation and generosity of our sponsors and donors like you. Because of your steadfast support of our mission, we are able to share music with more and more members of our community each season, and we can look ahead with confidence to a bright future.

We hope you will enjoy this Annual Report which highlights our favorite moments and shows how important your gifts have been.

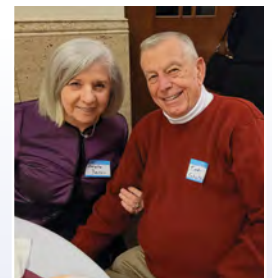

We acknowledge that we have lost many other family members this year too but wish to express special gratitude to the individuals listed below, who have made a lasting impact over the past fifty years.

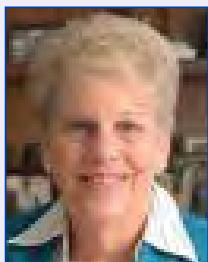


Lois Lehrman Grass (1931-2022)

Harrisburg native Lois Lehrman Grass lived a life of passionate community service which gained her recognition as a Distinguished Daughter of Pennsylvania. In the tradition of a true arts patron, she fostered the careers of promising young talents, often through commissions of their work. Her support of the Symphony has helped bring many new compositions to the HSO stage, most recently by composers Anna Clyne, Jeremy Gill, Jennifer Higdon, and Jonathan Leshnoff. Lois was the recipient of the 2021 Keep the Music Playing Award from the Harrisburg Symphony Society.

William Lehr, Jr. (1940-2022)

William Lehr, Jr. was former Board Chair and Director Emeritus of the Harrisburg Symphony Association. Additionally, Bill served as Chairman of the boards of Americans for the Arts, WITF, Lebanon Valley College, Susquehanna Art Museum, The Foundation for Enhancing Communities, and was a Founding Director of Whitaker Center for the Arts and Science. His lasting legacy of inspirational leadership and generosity of spirit has been a driving force in the creation of a vibrant cultural scene in Central Pennsylvania.



June L. Shomaker (1934-2023)

June L. Shomaker was a professional cellist with the Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra for over 30 years and a Board member, named Director Emerita in 2015. She was also instrumental in the founding of Carlisle's Summerfair, a week of community events culminating in a free concert by the HSO. In recognition of June's extraordinary fundraising and to honor her memory, in July 2023 we inaugurated the annual June Shomaker Summerfair Concert presented by the Harrisburg Symphony.

Nancy C. Zimmerman (1931-2023)

Director Emerita Nancy C. Zimmerman served two terms as President of the Harrisburg Symphony Association, from 1989-1991 and again from 2003-2005, during which time the organization achieved its first million-dollar budget. Additionally, she served on the HSA board in various capacities as Vice President for Artistic Policy, Chairperson of Pops Concerts, and Vice President of Marketing. As part of the Orchestra's Four Score and More campaign, Nancy and her late husband Richard Zimmerman made a gift to endow the Masterworks Series in perpetuity.

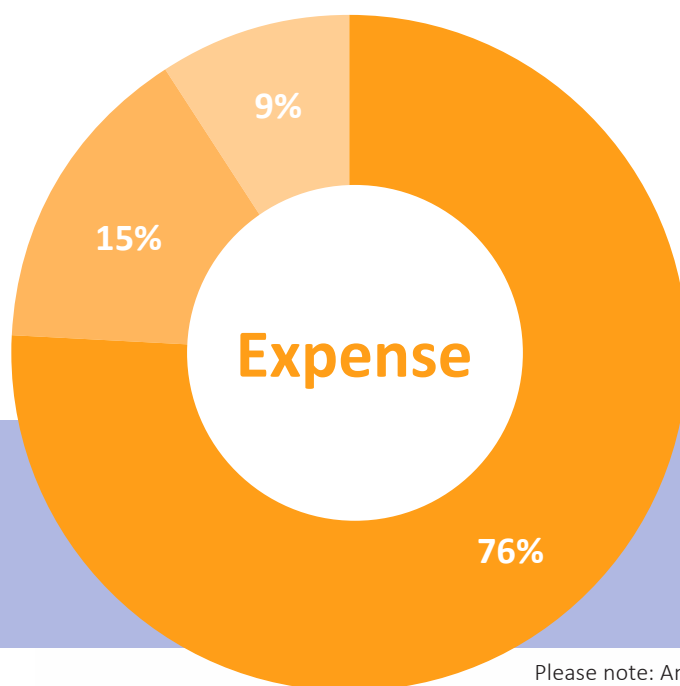

It is truly impossible to overstate the importance of Sue Klick's contributions to the HSO over the past 25 years. I don't know that I have ever worked with someone who more completely devoted their life to an orchestra. As the Director of Operations, Sue was the one who was ultimately responsible for every aspect of our HSO concerts short of the actual music making itself. She is obsessed with details, and I can remember few times when everything did not go perfectly, according to plan.

But Sue's importance goes so much deeper. I pride myself on the fact that the Harrisburg Symphony is a happy, collegial workplace, where the musicians feel well taken care of. Sue, in the end, was one of the most central reasons we have been able to maintain this high morale. Quite simply, the musicians of the HSO always knew that Sue had their backs. There was never a sense of "us vs. them" in the management/labor relationship at the HSO. When problems arose, she nipped them in the bud before they could escalate. She was compassionate when players had personal issues, and responsive when things went wrong. She sincerely cared about each player, not just the orchestra as a whole. I know they love her right back.

As for me, I have loved working with Sue, as I loved working with her husband Bill Schmieding, who preceded her in the job. She has been a close friend and colleague these many years, and I wish her nothing but the best in the next phase of her life. I will miss having her around.



The Harrisburg Symphony Youth Orchestras enjoyed a spectacular season this year that included lively rehearsals and inspiring performances. We were very excited to return to the Forum for our concerts, which gives them a little added panache, and which lets our students sit up taller and brag to their friends about the beautiful concert hall they play in.

We continue to rebuild to our pre-Covid numbers and are making progress. This season, the high school Youth Orchestra benefitted from college and professional musicians filling some crucial positions and providing not only missing notes but advice and coaching to those around them. This was also the first season since 2019 that the Youth Orchestra presented the Young Persons' Concert side-by-side with members of the Harrisburg Symphony! 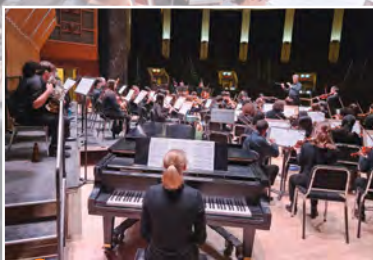

Youth Orchestra Alumni Spotlight

Malaysia Billman, HSYO Class of 2018

"I credit my participation in HSYO as being one of the main reasons I decided to pursue music performance in college and as a career."

My name is Malaysia Billman, and I am an alumna of both the Junior Youth String Orchestra (JYSO) (on cello) and Harrisburg Symphony Youth Orchestra (HSYO) (on oboe). I credit my participation in HSYO as being one of the main reasons I decided to pursue music performance in college and as a career. Playing in HSYO exposed me to so many incredible musical experiences and helped me to realize that music could be not only a life-long passion, but a career. Through playing advanced repertoire, working closely with my peers in both chamber ensembles and the full orchestra, and participating in various outreach performances, including the Strawberry Square Holiday concerts and LinkUp concerts, HSYO helped me grow as a musician and as a person, as I developed integral skills that have helped me through undergrad and beyond.

In 2018, I graduated from Cumberland Valley High School and headed to Chicago to attend Northwestern University. In 2022 I graduated cum laude from Northwestern University's Bienen School of Music with my Bachelor of Music. At Bienen, I double majored in Oboe Performance and Ethnomusicology and minored in German, studying oboe and English horn under the tutelage of Michael Henoch, Robert Morgan, and Scott Hostetler. During my time at Northwestern, I served as principal oboe of the Northwestern University Opera Orchestra, Contemporary Music Ensemble, and Symphonic Wind Ensemble and was an active chamber musician, performing with my woodwind quintet in the greater Chicago area. Additionally, I served as solo oboe and English horn in the 2022 Midwest premiere of Jake Heggie's opera "If I Were You" and I served as principal oboe for the Berlin Opera Academy's 2021 season in Switzerland. In 2022, I had the distinct honor of presenting my senior ethnomusicology thesis "Hopeful for a Bright Tomorrow": Songs and COVID-19 in Sub-Saharan Africa, at the 2022 Society for Ethnomusicology Annual Meeting in New Orleans.

After graduating from Northwestern, I moved back home to Pennsylvania for a gap year to prepare to pursue my master's degree in oboe performance in Berlin, Germany. During the past year I have performed with the York Symphony Orchestra and with other various ensembles around the Central Pennsylvania area. This past year, I also returned to the Harrisburg Symphony Youth Orchestra (HSYO) to serve as the interim HSYO Coordinator in winter 2023. Working with HSYO this year has been such a special opportunity as I have been able to interact with the next generation of HSYO musicians, and it is wonderful to see how the program has grown.

Music for Young Listeners

Over 1,500 elementary students shared educational and musical experiences through our Young Persons' Concert (YPC) series. These performances marked our first live YPCs since the fall of 2019. We watched as many young listeners experienced an orchestral concert for the first time, danced in the aisles to Chuck Berry's *Johnny B. Goode*, and listened in awe as the Sporting Hill Singers joined the Harrisburg Symphony Youth Orchestras and the Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra to perform Carl Orff's *O Fortuna*.

Our Musical Chairs subscription program returned this season, offering families with children in grades K-12 affordable access to our full Masterworks series. Many Musical Chairs subscribers also participate in our Welcome to the Concert program, which includes a kid-specific printed program with musical activities and listening guides and an intermission workshop. Through Welcome to the Concert, young listeners learn about the different instrument families in the orchestra, musical forms, and even how to conduct an orchestra.

Musician Residency Program

For a second season, our Musician Residency Program (MRP) paired HSO musicians with local high school music programs. Our resident musicians and partner schools included Cedar Cliff High School and Ai-lin Hsieh (cello), West Perry High School and David DiGiacobbe (principal flute), and Central Dauphin High School and Chris Rose (principal percussion).

While our musicians continued to work with students in masterclasses, small group and private lessons, and full ensemble rehearsals, we also found new opportunities to share music with our partner schools. Students from the Cedar Cliff High School and Allen Middle School orchestras joined us for our April Masterworks concert featuring HSO Concertmaster Peter Sirotn, and the Central Dauphin Ramband Drumline performed alongside the Harrisburg Symphony Youth Orchestra, members of the HSO, and the Sporting Hill Singers as part of our spring Young Persons' Concert.

We asked some of our partner teachers to share how our Musician Residency Program has impacted their students. Here is what they said:

- Sam Tate, Band Director, and Music Educator at Central Dauphin High School: "The HSO's residency program is an absolutely essential part of our music students' education. Over the past two years, we have worked with Mr. Chris Rose who has shared his expertise and experience with our percussion students. Our students and I have developed awesome relationships with Chris, allowing us to work towards high-level music making and percussion excellence in our classes! He's fantastic and we couldn't do it without the HSO's residency program."
